The 'Living Through the English Civil Wars' project run by 'The Friends of Warwickshire County Record Office' and funded by National Lottery players through the Heritage Lottery Fund is aiming to find out. It's training volunteers to transcribe Parliamentary accounts for Warwickshire which detail the losses in taxation, free quarter and plunder faced by communities and individuals throughout the county. The digitised 'Accounts' will be published on a public website and in a volume by the Dugdale Society.
